PHYSICAL ACTIVITY LEVELS

- **Little to no physical exertion**, with most experiences conducted while seated or stationary. Ideal for those who prefer relaxation.
Example: Scenic drives, guided excursions on a coach, or visits to sites with minimal walking.

- **Involves some walking and light movement**, suitable for participants of all fitness levels. Activities may include short walks or gentle exploration.
Example: Strolling through markets, visiting museums, or participating in low-impact experiences.

Embark on a captivating lighthouse exploration along the stunning coastline of Maine, where history, maritime heritage, and breathtaking views await! This unforgettable journey includes visits to three iconic lighthouses, each with its unique charm and history.

The picturesque Portland Head Light, one of the most photographed lighthouses in the United States, was built in 1791. This historic beacon stands sentinel on the rugged shores of Cape Elizabeth. Enjoy a leisurely walk around the surroundings, taking in stunning ocean views and exploring the nearby museum that delves into the rich maritime history of the area.

Encounter the charming Portland Breakwater Light, affectionately known as Bug Light. This iconic structure, completed in 1875, is a delightful sight with its unique design and vibrant white color. Sit back, relax, and enjoy the stellar P.E.I. terrain as you travel northward to Cavendish, home of Green Gables Heritage Place, the endearingly quaint house that inspired a children's classic. In fact, it's hard to think of Prince Edward Island without mentioning author Lucy Maud Montgomery, who lived here during the late Victorian era and used P.E.I. as the setting for her beloved novel, *Anne of Green Gables*.

Published in 1908, this tale of a spunky, straw-hatted, red-haired orphan became an instant hit – and from that moment onwards, visitors have flocked to Cavendish, leading to the establishment of the National Park Historic Site. You'll find the homestead immortalized in the book to be exceptionally beautiful in real life, and you're also sure to enjoy exploring the grounds you've read or heard so much about. The landscape surrounding the property is breathtaking, as is the farm, decorated in authentic pieces from the period in which the story is set.

A new interpretive center opened on the property in 2019 and offers a wealth of information about this historic site. Don't miss it!

Departing from Port Charlottetown, you will set out on a scenic drive into the Island's picturesque central region. Your knowledgeable guide will entertain you with stories and history of the Island. Along this coastline, you will see plenty of what our Island is most well-known for: oyster & mussel leases, and some lobster traps along the way. Long considered one of the world's tastiest oysters, the Malpeque oyster has been farmed in these cold waters for generations. Still today, oyster fishers set out in their dories and pluck the shellfish from the bottom of local rivers and bays with a set of long wooden tongs.

Your drive will take you to Raspberry Point Oyster Company, where the team of oyster experts will teach you all about the oyster industry, the difference between standard and choice oysters, and about "merroir." After your lesson, an expert oyster shucker will also give you the opportunity to try your hand at shucking. The experience wouldn't be complete without a sampling! These are the cleanest and freshest oysters you will ever taste!

As you make your way back to the Seaport, one last stop at another beloved local property - Prince Edward Island Preserve Company. Located on the beautiful River Clyde, here you will have some free time to wander their beautiful property and sample some of the tasty jams and preserves made right onsite. A final relaxing drive will bring you back to the Seaport.

Stroll along Rue de la Reine, the main artery lined with charming boutiques, colorful storefronts, cafés, and cultural landmarks. It was here that Jacques Cartier made landfall in 1534, marking one of the earliest recorded encounters between Europeans and this part of North America. Experience interactive multimedia exhibits and discover over 250 fascinating artifacts and archival documents that reveal Gaspé's past from a fresh perspective.

Experience Gaspé as it was in 1900 at this immersive historical site, made up of one authentic heritage building and six carefully reconstructed ones—all brought to life by costumed interpreters portraying real figures from the town's past. Each building houses a unique interpretation zone, complete with artifacts from private collections, informative panels, and lively historical re-enactments. The site also features artworks and contemporary elements that offer a fresh perspective on the region's rich history

Embark on a scenic coastal drive to Forillon National Park, where you will meet your captain and whale-watching guide at the historic Grande-Grave pier. Board a large zodiac boat and head out into the blue waters of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, one of the most active marine habitats in Eastern Canada. Depending on the season and available food sources, you may encounter the impressive blue whale—the largest mammal on Earth—along with humpback whales known for their spectacular breaching displays, the long, slender fin whale, or the elusive minke whale. Atlantic white-sided dolphins, harbor porpoises, and curious seals are also frequent visitors to these rich feeding grounds, making every outing unique.

After your time on the water, return to Grande-Grave, where you will have a moment to take in the peaceful landscapes of the park. Enjoy time at your leisure to explore the area's coastal trails, heritage buildings, or interpretive signage that highlights the region's fishing history and natural environment before rejoining your transportation.

St. Amélie Church • Manic-2 Hydro Dam • Georges d'Or Pavilion

This panoramic excursion offers a captivating blend of history, culture, and industrial innovation. Learn about the town's founding by Colonel Robert McCormick, who established a pulp and paper mill in 1937 to reduce costs and built the town around it. Admire the striking architecture of St. Amélie Church, a granite landmark perched above the bay. Built in the 1940s, this elegant church is a symbol of Baie-Comeau's heritage and offers panoramic views of the town and surrounding landscapes.

Then, visit one of the world's largest hollow-joint gravity dams—so massive a Boeing 747 could fit inside one of its joints! It is here that, in 1965, Hydro-Québec operated the first 735,000-volt line in the world. This line has now become the international standard for high-voltage transmission and is linked to a generating station powerful enough to supply electricity to a city of 250,000 people. Visit the Georges d'Or Pavilion, which holds an actual turbine, an exhibit hall, and a multimedia room that explains the construction and operation of the dam. Watch a 30-minute film about the station's impressive generators.

Your excursion ends with a short panoramic tour of Baie-Comeau's heritage area and its beautiful natural setting.

Village Forestier d'Antan (Lumberjack Village) • Champlain Street

Your day starts with a visit to a typical Lumberjack Village, a forest interpretation center known as Village Forestier d'Antan. Since the forest industry was crucial to the development of the North Shore, activities such as cutting, hauling, driving, and other aspects of life in the forest are presented. Experience the lumberjack's living conditions and way of life. A sample of a typical lumberjack meal will be served.

The excursion continues to Champlain Street where the former Premier of Canada, Brian Mulroney, spent his childhood. A stop at the famous French colonial hotel, the Manoir of Baie-Comeau, will have your taste buds delighted with cake and tea accompanied by storytelling. This sumptuous manor was first built in 1937 by Robert Rutherford McCormick but burned to the ground in 1965. It was only 39 years later, in 2004, that the QNSL paper company rebuilt it on the same site, using stone instead of wood!

Your experience ends with a short exploration of Baie-Comeau's heritage area and its beautiful natural setting. Drive by Place La Salle, and discover this quaint commercial artery, host to sites of historical and social interest for the past 78 years.

Begin your journey with a scenic drive through La Baie, where the impressive Saguenay Fjord cuts deep into the Laurentian Mountains. A visit to the Fjord Museum will reveal the fascinating history of this natural wonder and the secrets hidden beneath its waters. Along the way, you'll pass the Ha! Ha! Pyramid, a striking monument honoring the resilience of the community after the devastating 1996 flood, and learn more about how this region has rebuilt itself with pride and determination.

You'll have the opportunity for a photo stop at La Pulperie de Chicoutimi, a historic paper mill turned cultural center. Once a major producer of wood pulp for European markets, it now offers exhibits on local history, art, and traditions that showcase the unique character of the Saguenay region. Take in the surrounding scenery and enjoy a moment to appreciate this blend of industrial heritage and cultural preservation before returning to the ship.

Step back in time and discover the artisans of a bygone era. Your journey begins at the Fromagerie Boivin, where you'll sample delicious cheeses while learning about the history of this family-run dairy. Producing an impressive 2.3 million kilos of cheese annually, this long-standing enterprise has perfected the craft of cheese-making, blending tradition with quality.

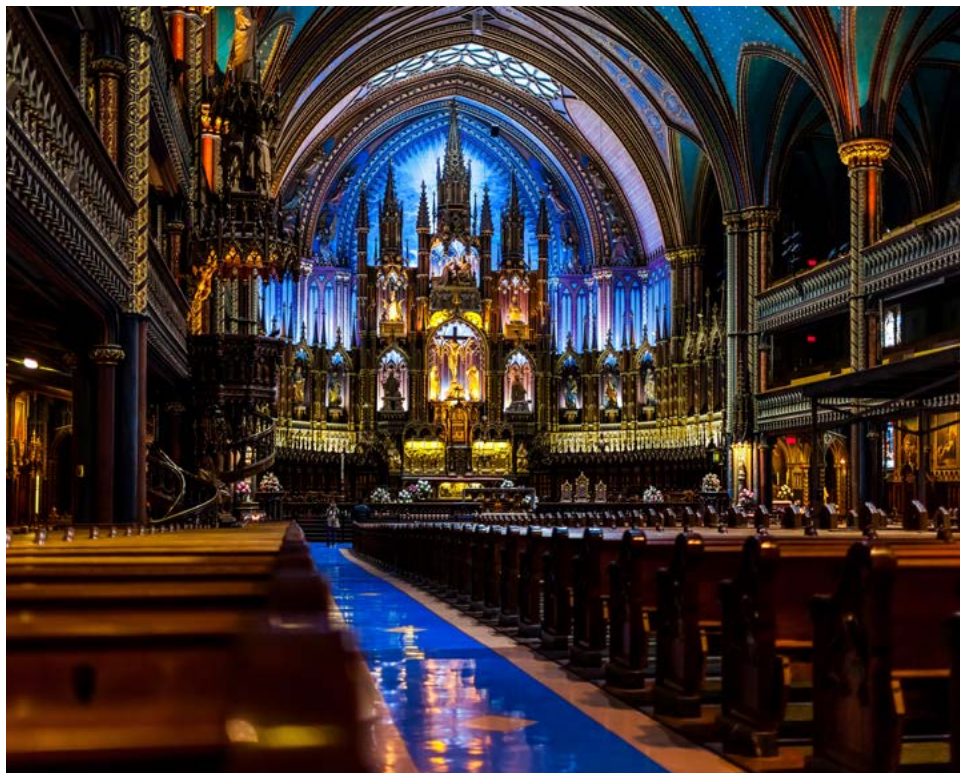

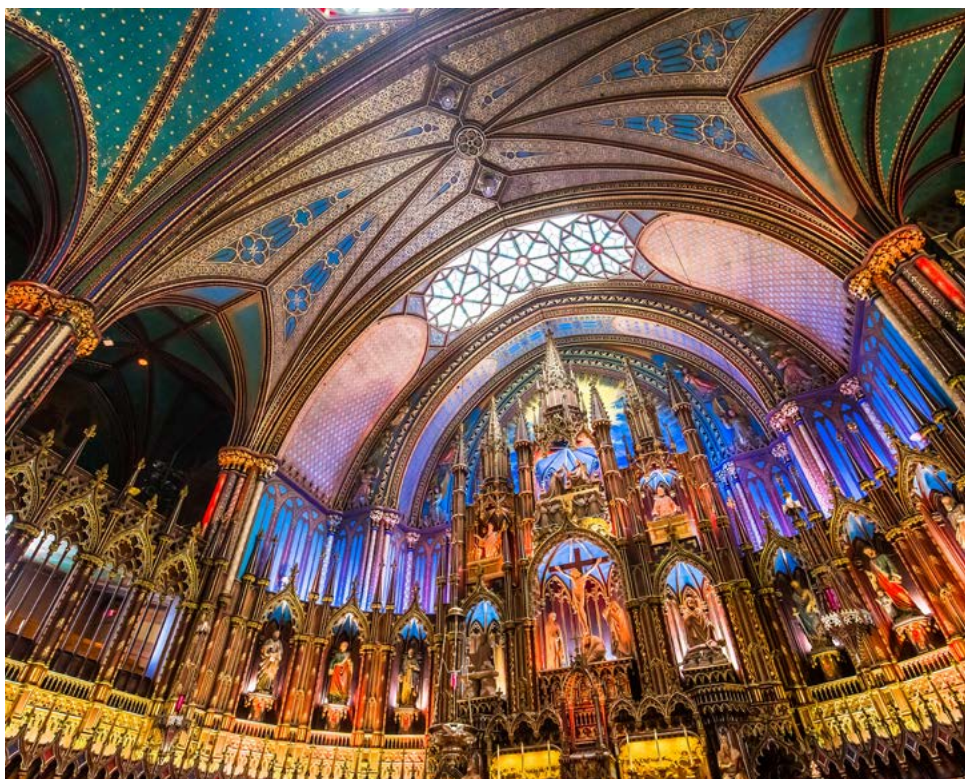

The surrounding grounds contain ten restored historic theme gardens.

Stan Hywet Estate became a key meeting place for Seiberling and his business associates, serving as a hub for discussions and negotiations on business challenges of the time. The estate's Gate Lodge holds its own special historical significance. It was here, in 1935, that a now-famous family meeting took place to contend with the struggles several members faced with alcoholism. That lengthy session led to the founding of Alcoholics Anonymous, the organization that has since provided life-changing support to millions worldwide. The legacy of that pivotal meeting continues to inspire hope and recovery for individuals to this day – another facet of the enduring impact the Seiberling family has had on both the business world and society at large.

First, you'll be guided through the Saarinen House, considered the jewel of Cranbrook's architectural treasures and located at the heart of the Cranbrook Academy of Art. This stunning Art Deco masterwork was completed in the late 1920s, and from 1930 to 1950 served as the home and studio of its visionary Finnish-American designer, Eliel Saarinen—Cranbrook's first resident architect and the Art Academy's first president and head of its Architecture Department—and his wife, Loja Saarinen, first head of the Academy's Weaving Department and director of Studio Loja Saarinen. The carefully restored interior features the Saarinens' original furnishings, including Eliel's delicately veneered furniture, Loja's sumptuous textiles, decorative embellishments by their daughter, Pipsan Saarinen Swanson, and early furniture designs by their son, Eero Saarinen. Quite the family project.

Next, your intimate group will explore Frank Lloyd Wright's Smith House, completed in 1950 for schoolteachers Sara Stein Smith and Melvyn Maxwell Smith. Undeterred by their modest salaries and guided by a shared love of architecture, the Smiths met with Frank Lloyd Wright at his Taliesin studio in 1941 to commission a custom home. After numerous delays, including World War II, the Smith House in Bloomfield Township was completed—and remains a superb example of Wright's Usonian ideal, which aimed to build quality houses for the American middle class. Preserved and curated by Cranbrook, this ingeniously free-flowing home features many of the designer's signature details, and original furnishings and handcrafted pieces allow visitors to truly experience the atmosphere of a Frank Lloyd Wright classic.

These homes are not wheelchair accessible. There are stairs and narrow doorways that could present a problem for guests with mobility impairments. Additionally, the structures are not air-conditioned and will be hot during the summer months.

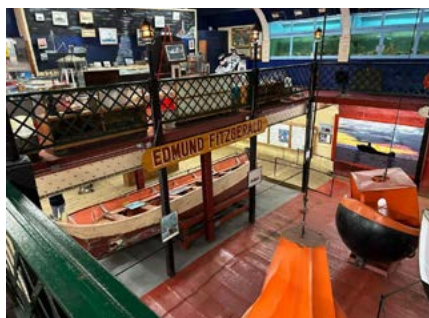

From fisheries management and aquaculture to invasive species monitoring, food web study, and fostering freshwater conservation, Lake Superior State University's dockside center for all freshwater research will be open for you to explore at your leisure. The center is mere steps away from the ship and boasts a state-of-the-art water quality laboratory equipped with the most advanced technology and tools. In keeping with the institution's commitment to community outreach, you'll find docents stationed around the building—ready to field your questions and provide background on the region and the center's broad roster of programs.

Next up on your journey is the Museum Ship Valley Camp, where you'll explore a historic freighter whose massive cargo holds have been transformed into a 20,000-square-foot museum filled with unique maritime exhibits. Among them are the actual Captain's Quarters and two rare surviving artifacts from the ill-fated Great Lakes freighter Edmund Fitzgerald—a pair of lifeboats torn away during her 1975 sinking.

First opened in 1855 along the St. Marys River that separates Michigan's Upper Peninsula from Ontario, the Soo Locks enable ship traffic to pass between Lake Superior and the lower Great Lakes, as well as the St. Lawrence Seaway and the international markets beyond. This vital transportation link facilitates the movement of some 10,000 vessels and nearly 86 million tons of cargo each year, including an impressive 95% of the United States' iron ore. And that's despite being closed during the hard winter months!

Venture up to the observation platform, where you can witness the fascinating locking process underway as huge freighters and smaller recreational boats navigate through the locks. It's a unique opportunity to see these engineering marvels in action—and contemplate the significance of how this waterway fits within the map of global trade. Displays within the adjacent Soo Locks Visitor Center offer background on the system's original construction and subsequent modernizations.

After exploring the locks, you'll have time to visit the quaint downtown on your own. Grab a sweet treat or shop the boutiques for the perfect gift to take home.

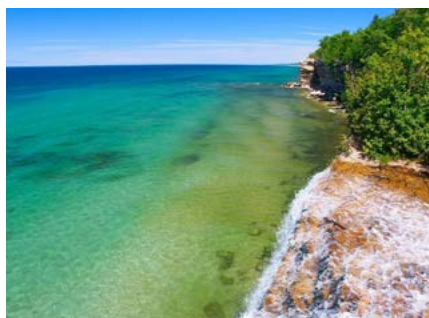

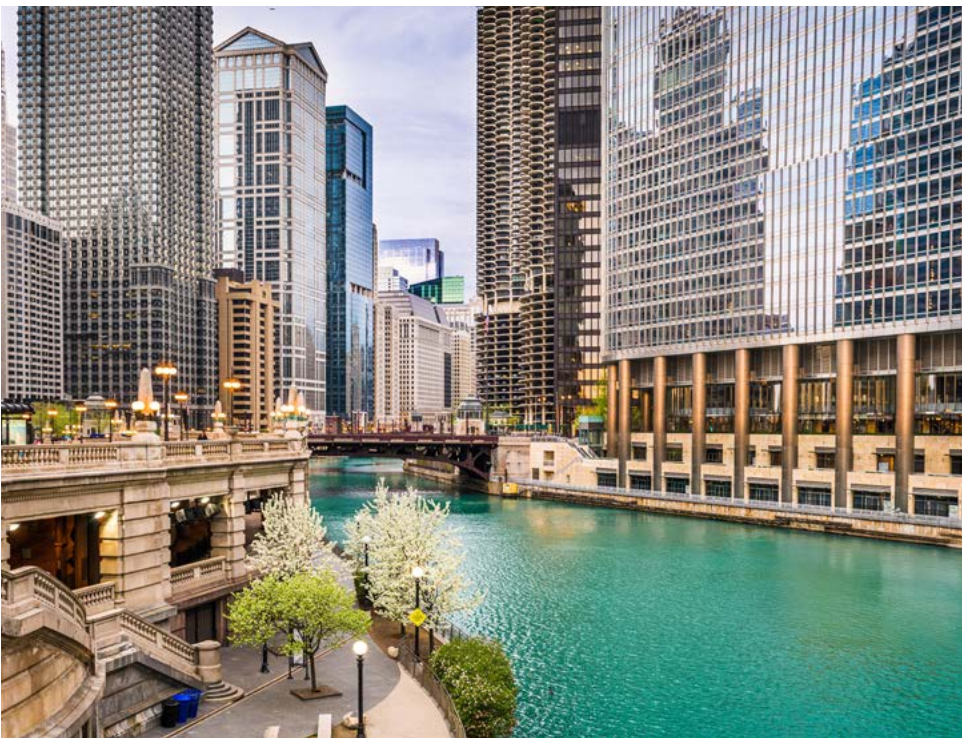

Narrated Chicago River architecture cruise

Much like the human arterial system, the Chicago River carries the flow of life to and from the heart of the city. Its three branches run for a combined 186 miles. Dozens of landmark buildings line its route—including stunners like the Wrigley Building, a skyscraping monument to chewing gum that sported Chicago's first air-conditioned offices; the jet-black, slope-sided John Hancock Building, 100 stories tall plus its twin signature antennas; and the still loftier Willis Tower (aka the Sears Tower), which opened in 1973 and reigned as the world's tallest building until the late '90s.

Multiple bridges cross its waters—some 38 at last count—including ones at Outer Drive, Columbus Drive, Michigan Avenue, Wabash Avenue, State Street, Dearborn Street, Clark Street, La Salle Street, and a slew of other streets named for US Presidents.

These sights and landmarks are but a sampling of what you'll discover as you explore the city and its river by boat, with a local expert providing backstories and fascinating insights into the events that have shaped the Windy City's incomparable architectural history.

Frank Lloyd Wright is considered one of the most innovative, forward-thinking American architects for good reason. And you will encounter a number of those reasons on this immersive experience.

His career extended from the late 19th century to the mid-20th century and yielded iconic works that consistently broke new ground in form, function, and integration with nature. To introduce you to his work and vision properly, you'll begin the day with a guided exploration of his former personal home and studio in Oak Park, with time allocated to stroll the grounds and surrounding area where other Wright homes create something of a neighborhood museum.

Nearby, the Unity Temple stands as a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site and the architect's most notable public building in Chicago. Yet another stunner on your agenda is the Robie House—a Prairie-style masterwork completed in 1910 and still considered one of the most important residential buildings in architectural history. Spend some fascinating time in the past as you step aboard the famous Muskegon Trolley on an excursion into Muskegon history. Your first stop is at a pair of exquisite Queen Anne landmark mansions known as the Hackley & Hume Historic Site. Designed by the same prominent Victorian-era architect and lived in by neighboring lumber barons Charles Hackley and Thomas Hume, birth of the homes features superbly period details—carvings, moldings, stained glass windows, and more—all wonderfully preserved for your exploration.

Of course, with wooden mansions comes fire. Just a short distance away is the Fire Barn Museum, a testament to the city's resilience. After devastating 1870s fires ravaged the area, the same Charles Hackley whose house you just toured made a founding donation to sponsor the C. H. Hackley Hose Company No. 2 firehouse—where Muskegon's first 12 firemen and their equipment stood ready for calamity. Step inside to explore the museum's collection of early firefighting history, memorabilia, and equipment. Then wander next door to visit the Scolnik House of the Depression Era, a true time capsule of what it was like to be a typical Muskegon family living through the Great Depression. Step inside and find yourself smack dab in the 1930s.

Your final stop, the Muskegon Heritage Museum of Business and Industry, showcases the region's rich contributions to America's industrial and economic history. In its extensive three-story collection are engaging artifacts, rare photos, and working model displays of vintage machines like a Corliss valve steam engine, a printing letterpress, and a Brunswick Bowling pinsetter. Docents and staff are happy to provide insights and field questions.

Journey from the elegance of Victory II to the annals of maritime and wartime history as you explore three heritage ships that each played a pivotal role in the story. Your first stop is the iconic S.S. Milwaukee Clipper, a passenger and freight steamer first launched in 1904, seven years before the Titanic, then massively modernized in the 1940s for luxury cross-lake travel between Buffalo and Duluth. Explore the ship and discover staterooms that serve as a time capsule transporting you back to the golden age of “moderne” Great Lakes travel.

Jumping from leisure to war, you'll next visit the USS Silversides submarine. Commissioned just eight days after the Dec. 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor, the USS Silversides completed 14 war patrols between 1942 and 1945 and sank an impressive 23 ships. In her faithfully preserved state, modern visitors can climb aboard and get a feel for what sailors' daily lives were like inside a WWII Gato-class sub. Almost every room inside the submarine is available for you to experience – and it's quite an experience! If you'd rather stay ashore, dive into the fascinating exhibits inside the two-story Silversides Museum and capture the story there.

Next, you'll walk where thousands of heroes walked, on a visit to the USS LST 393 Veterans Museum. Launched from Virginia in '42, the USS LST 393 was a Landing Ship Tank – a design optimized for the quick unloading of armored vehicles and personnel onto unimproved beaches. Pressed into action soon after the WWII debacle at Dunkirk, she went on to complete 75 voyages to shore across three continents, transporting over 9,000 soldiers, 3,200 vehicles, and 5,000 prisoners – including landings at Normandy. Take your time exploring this venerable ship as you learn more about the role she played in supporting the U.S. in the European Theatre.

1853 Marquette Harbor Lighthouse

Overlooking Lake Superior sits a museum dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich maritime history of all five Great Lakes, the Marquette region, and the memory of the many brave submarine veterans who have served our nation. Housed in the 1891 city waterworks building – a stonemason's masterpiece—its engaging displays include a significant collection of 19th-century Fresnel lenses, heritage diving gear, an Edmund Fitzgerald exhibit, and much more by way of maritime and Coast Guard memorabilia.

After surveying that impressive aggregation, proceed out back and discover the Marquette Lighthouse, originally built in 1853 to help protect ship traffic in the harbor. The keeper and his family first lived in the lighthouse, but as duties and equipment grew, more space was needed – and a barn behind the lighthouse was converted to expand the living quarters in 1898. By 1910, a second story had been added, with further modifications to follow—including a distinctive covered staircase and a bright red paint job. These unique alterations set this lighthouse apart from others on the Great Lakes, leading to its inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. During your visit, you'll learn how Lake Superior shaped Marquette and the iron ore industry and have an opportunity to ascend inside the lighthouse.

Come peruse as many of them as you wish during your self-guided visit to this world-renowned repository of all things mineral, located on the campus of Michigan Technological University in Houghton.

For centuries, the Keweenaw Peninsula's extraordinary geology—including a vast bed of copper ore—has drawn adventurers and industrialists from around the world in pursuit of fame and fortune. At the museum, you'll learn all about the region's unique geology and mining history. In addition, the curators can provide an exclusive behind-the-scenes look at the diverse geological variations of the Great Lakes. You'll depart with fresh insights on Upper Michigan's unique formations and ecosystems – and the intricate interplay between geology and natural history here.

Isle Royale National Park's main island—along with another 400 or so smaller ones scattered in the waters of Lake Superior around it—is an unspoiled natural paradise completely free of cars, clad in lush forest, and teeming with diverse wildlife. At 45 miles long by 9 miles wide, it's the fourth-largest lake island on the planet. While you won't be setting foot on the isle itself during this journey, Victory II will glide gracefully near its shoreline—and odds are good that you may spot majestic moose in their natural habitat.

Here's some other good news: The Park's main Visitor Center is conveniently located in downtown Houghton, just about an 8-minute stroll from Victory Cruise Lines's docking location, which makes it very tempting to drop by for a visit. You can browse the informative park store, chat with knowledgeable rangers, and even snag a unique stamp for your National Park Passport.

With an expert guide leading the way, you'll descend into the depths of the mine, explore its labyrinthine maze of tunnels, and learn firsthand about the challenges and triumphs faced by the miners who toiled here. You'll marvel at the remarkable engineering feats that allowed them to extract copper from the earth, while also gaining an appreciation for their dogged resilience and surprising ingenuity.

Enjoy a scenic drive along the Copper Country Trail National Byway and discover the Keweenaw Peninsula's history and natural beauty at each stop. Whether your passion is lighthouse photography, waterfall watching, mining history—or all the above—you'll surely find it along this route.

The region's story is intimately tied to its unique geology and Lake Superior. During the copper mining boom years, Superior's turbulent waters were the primary source of transport for people, supplies, and copper—and numerous lighthouses helped guide ships navigating the coast. One you'll see from McLain State Park is the North Entry Lighthouse. Another you'll explore and be able to photograph up close is Eagle Harbor Lighthouse; its surrounding museums include Keweenaw History Museum, Commercial Fishing Museum, and the Lighthouse Museum.

Waterfalls on the Keweenaw are a powerful draw for residents and visitors alike – and once helped power the mining industry. You'll see some of their impressive natural beauty at Eagle River Falls and Jacob Falls.

A scenic drive along Brockway Mountain Drive leads to Fort Wilkins Historic State Park, where you'll enjoy a leisurely guided walk as you learn about the far northern part of the Keweenaw. Before leaving Copper Harbor, we'll stop to visit the origin point of US 41; one of America's longest highways, it runs all the way from Michigan to Miami.

And don't worry – you won't go hungry today. The famous Fitzgerald's Restaurant will be opening specifically for you to savor its coastal cuisine—and outstanding views.

Enger Tower • Glensheen Mansion & Gardens

Venture inside two iconic Duluth landmarks and get a vivid sense of the historic fortunes once amassed as this city grew up along the far west corner of Lake Superior. Your first icon is Enger Tower, built in 1939 on land generously donated by Bert Enger, a Norwegian immigrant who found great success with his furniture store in the west end of Duluth. The 80-foot bluestone tower stands atop the lakeside bluffs as a tribute to his legacy—and offers those who venture up the stairs to its top a reward of delightful breezes and breathtaking panoramic views of the sparkling lake and surroundings below. The parkland and gardens here are also home to the Japanese Peace Bell, a gift from Duluth's sister city Ohara-Isumi.

Then it's on to Glensheen, the cozy 39-room mansion where the Chester Congdon family's life of vast wealth epitomized the pivotal role the iron mining boom played in shaping early Duluth. Congdon was a key figure in the industry, significantly influencing its growth and parlaying his strategic vision into a vast fortune as a matchmaker and early investor in the partnership of Oliver Mining Company and Rockefeller rival Andrew Carnegie—a union that led to the creation of U.S. Steel.

Glensheen, completed in 1908, was envisioned as a family home despite its gargantuan proportions. Its sprawling 27,000 square feet of meticulously designed living space is nestled on 22 acres of pristine lakeshore and showcases exemplary architectural details and furnishings that speak to the Congdons' refined tastes. Today, you'll step directly back into their opulent era as you enter the manse as a modern visitor and see the Congdon family's original possessions. Enjoy a detailed tour as your knowledgeable guide provides the inspiring story of Chester and Clara Congdon, their six children, and the grand rooms and grounds where they lived their lives. It's another page in the rich history that continues to resonate in Duluth today.

Two Harbors Lighthouse • Betty's Pies • Gooseberry Falls State Park • Split Rock Lighthouse

The spectacles of a driving exploration along Minnesota's North Shore are many—sparkling Lake Superior views on one side, unspoiled landscapes and rocky bluffs on the other, and memorable landmarks to discover all along the way.

Your journey begins with a visit to Two Harbors, where you will be introduced to the history of the town and significance of its iconic locations. The Two Harbors Lighthouse (1892) is Minnesota's oldest operating light station, a carefully restored classic overlooking Agate Bay providing an opportunity to explore the adjacent grounds and museum. You'll also have time to visit Two Harbors Railroad Museum that offers a glimpse into the rail industry's past.

No visit to the North Shore is considered complete without a stop at Betty's Pies. Enjoy a tasty lunch here but make sure to save room for a slice of their namesake pie. Once you've had your fill, your adventure continues to Gooseberry Falls State Park. Nestled near the coastline, the park offers an Interpretative Visitor Center and a paved pathway to multi-tiered Gooseberry Falls. You'll want to have your camera at hand.

But the most photographed sight of all has been saved for last: Split Rock Lighthouse—perched high atop a sheer rock cliff and widely considered the most spectacular lighthouse on the Great Lakes. The most iconic images of Split Rock are taken from the beach near the boathouse, accessible by a gradual path or stairway. If you prefer a more leisurely visit, you can explore the museum or relax in the theater to watch a film that provides the history of the area; you can also climb the lighthouse and explore the 25-acre historic site featuring the keeper's house and other support buildings.

Kakabeka Falls • Henry Alexander Icebreaker

Explore scenic trails that reveal the area's rich natural beauty and fascinating geological history. Keep your eyes open for glimpses of local wildlife as you wander along the accessible Boardwalk Trail, or challenge yourself on the Little Falls Trail, which winds down into the heart of the gorge.

Whether you're seeking a peaceful nature walk or a dramatic photo opportunity, Kakabeka Falls promises a truly unforgettable adventure.

You can also choose to visit the Henry Alexander, a retired icebreaker that sits steps from your ship. Discover the crown jewel of Thunder Bay's Transportation Museum as you come aboard a piece of Canadian maritime history. Learn about the Canadian Coast Guard icebreaker that ensured safe passage through the icy waters of the Great Lakes from 1959 to 1985 and its vital role in shaping Canada's maritime legacy.

Fort William Historical Park • Anishinaabe Encampment

Depart modern-day Thunder Bay by coach for a scenic drive to Fort William Historical Park and the year 1816. Time has been stopped here in one of North America's largest living-history museum sites, a fully reconstructed early 19th-century fur trading post.

Once there, choose your preferred means of reaching the Anishinaabe Encampment, home to Indigenous Peoples of the Anishinaabe Nation and Fort William. Your knowledgeable guide will recount fascinating tales from the 19th century—when the two cultures first met and tenuous relationships were forged between original First Nations people and the non-Indigenous newcomers.

Continue along the path back to Fort William, where docents in period costume recreate the hustle and bustle of daily life with active fur trading by the North West Company underway—exactly like it was over 200 years ago. Even if skeptical, you may find yourself convinced you've time traveled.

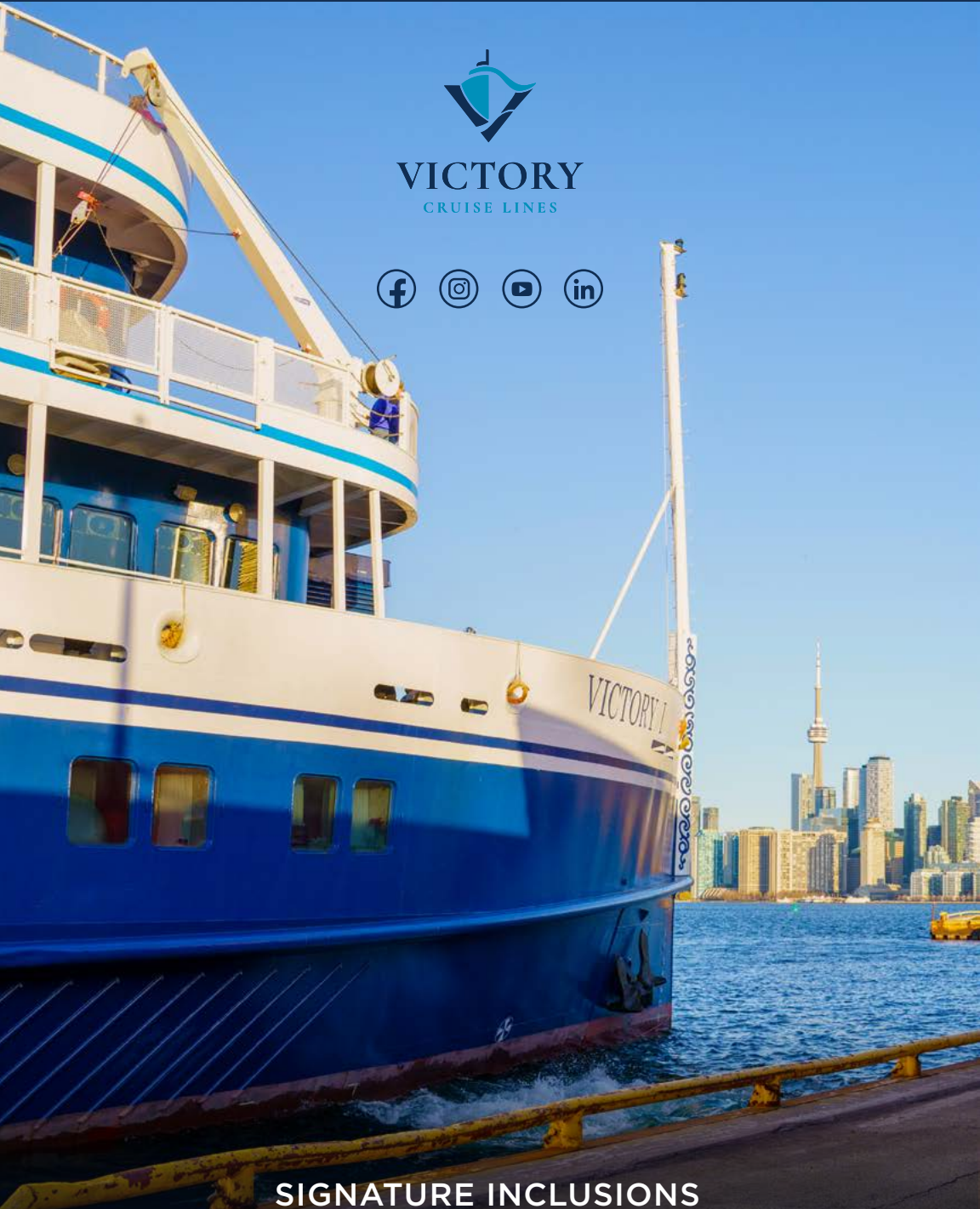
